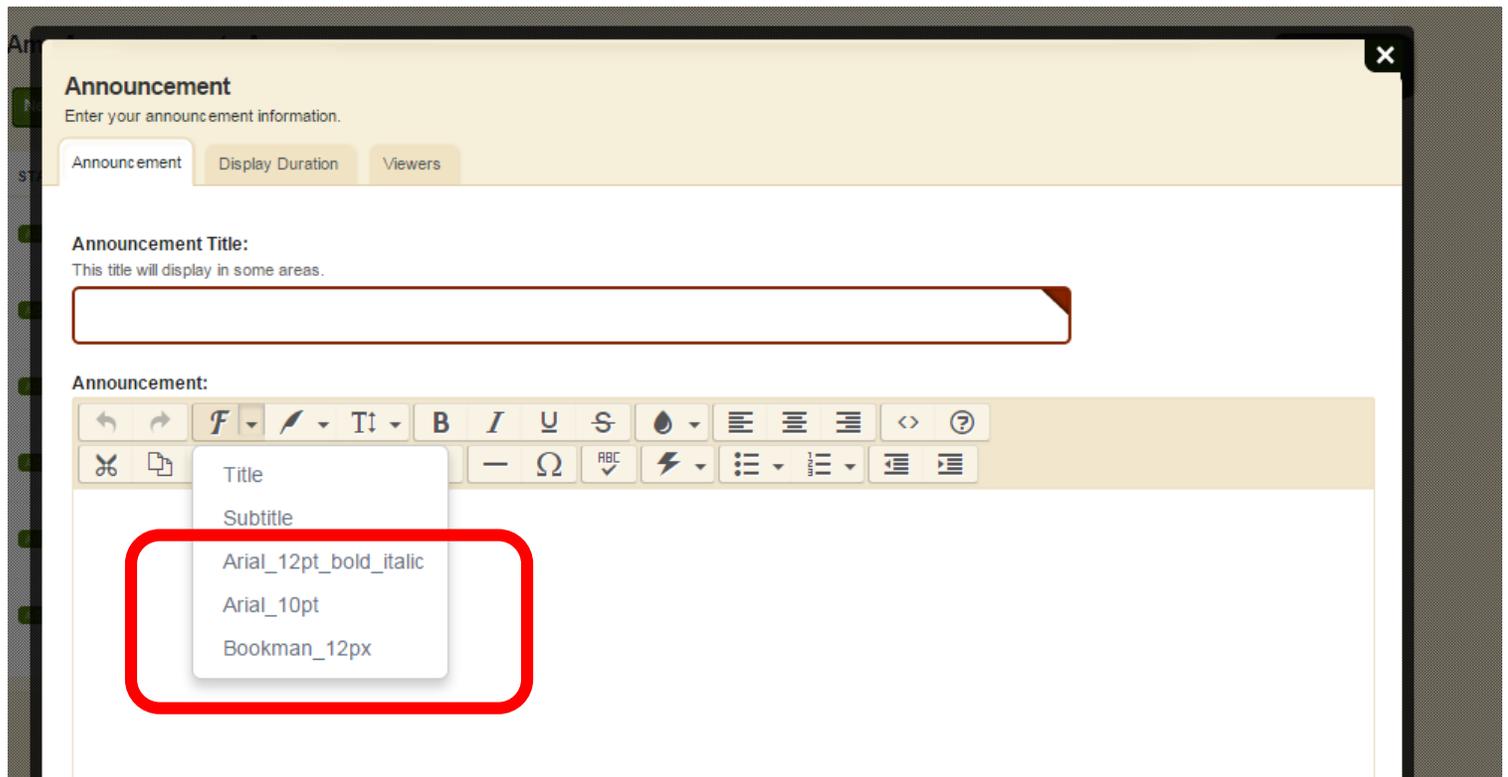
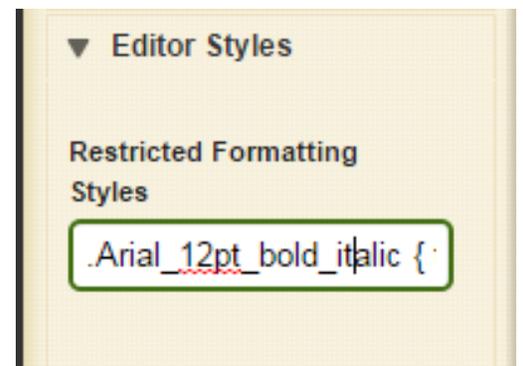


The newer and more basic Schoolwires editor, which can be found in the Announcement, Content, and Headlines & Features apps, pulls font styles from your template's coding. To add more font options for this simpler editor, you must create a new template editor style using CSS. When this has been done, you'll see your new styles showing up in this list inside the editor:



### Here is how you add new font editor styles:

1. In Site Manager, navigate to the Site Workspace > "Settings" button at the top > "Advanced" tab > "Change" button.
2. Expand "Editor Styles" and add your styles in the "Restricted Formatting Styles" field (see image on right). You can add more than one style in this field.
3. Remember to **Publish** your template.
4. The styles will now show in the list as shown in the above screen shot.



### To create new styles, you need to use a specific format & CSS. The format is as follows:

```
.fontexample { font-family: Arial; font-size: 30px; font-style: italic; color: #0505ff; }
```

Some details to note when writing out your styles are:

- Your style name must be one word and start with a "." (NO spaces!)
- Your style must be surrounded by { }
- Each declaration must have a semi-colon at the end.

You can add other font properties, such as to make it bold or italicized, or to set the color. The following examples would create the 3 styles that are showing in the list in the screen shot above:

```
.Arial_12pt_bold_italic { font-family: Arial; font-size: 12pt; font-weight: bold; font-style: italic; color: #000080;}
```

```
.Arial_10pt { font-family: Arial; font-size: 10pt; color: #000000;}
```

```
.Bookman_12px { font-family: Bookman Old Style; font-size: 12px; color: #000000;}
```

They show in the list as:

Arial\_12pt\_bold\_italic

Arial\_10pt

Bookman\_12px
